Subject: OEA RA: What does it mean to be a "late" delegate?

Good afternoon OEA RA Delegates,

We are glad that you will be attending the 2019 OEA RA at Red Lion Jantzen Beach on April 26 and 27 and want to make sure you are aware of the process for "late registered delegates."

You may or may not already know that you are a "late" delegate, which means that the delegate reporting form for your local was submitted after the March 12 deadline.

What this means is that you are not able to go onto the RA floor until the motion to seat late delegates has passed; this motion is the first order of business once the meeting is called to order at 6:30 pm. The Credentials Committee Members at the entrance to the RA floor look at badges to determine who has floor privileges, and they only allow authorized delegates to access the RA floor; your badge will indicate that you are not allowed on the floor until after the motion has passed.

You can be in the back of the ballroom in the guest area, and you can have your Board Director or another delegate who is not a 'late' delegate place your items on a table in your section for you so that you don't have to pack them around with you until the meeting starts.
